Read and Write Gold is an assistive technology program designed to provide literacy support for students of all ages and abilities. The software helps people who require extra assistance when reading or composing text, allowing students to develop their literacy skills and enjoy greater independence.

This tool is now available for our entire TDSB community <u>at no cost!</u> Not only can all schools use it, but students will also have access to Read and Write V.9 at home on their PC computers.

Parents will require a password through the school administrators. This can be found on the website below.



This tool is being made available through the Special Education department, with ongoing support and training available through the Assistive Technology Team.

Read and Write Gold is a user friendly, colourful program that engages students and motivates academic participation. This program has allowed our son to be more successful and has significantly increased his self- esteem.

The program is simple and engages the visual, auditory and oral senses. This multi-sensory approach to learning is key to supporting children with special needs. As we have recently learned, the computer utilizes a different/cognitive pathway than that used for printing by hand. Our son is able to skip the tedious process of writing and focus his energy on the learning process, thinking and making connections. He is better able to proficiently organize his thoughts, write reports and create webs.

We are grateful that our son is able to utilize this incredible program as it supports his learning needs in a user friendly way. We're truly appreciative for the opportunity to have it as an integrated part of our son's world. Success is always possible as new pathways are utilized. Learning Communities

The Assistive Technology Itinerant Teachers and Consultants hosted their first TDSB boardwide professional learning community session for interactive whiteboards.

The interactive whiteboard general session included

- a brief overview of the support structures that will be available to teachers for their professional development in the 2010-11 school year.
- the development of small Professional Learning Communities by grade level and exceptionalities. This gives teachers an opportunity to meet others in their PLCs that have students with similar needs, and share/discuss resources available for their interactive whiteboards.
- an explanation of "Job Embedded Professional Development" and "In-Class Support" offered by our department.
- a demonstration of the integration of Read and Write Gold software into a whiteboard lesson.

Ray Mirshahi at Timberbank Junior Public School introduced visiting teachers to how Clicker 5 can be used in both the special education and regular classroom.

Teachers also had the opportunity to observe primary and junior classes utilizing the interactive whiteboard for literacy and math instruction.

At Annette Street School, Angela Tucci-Brown highlighted how her Home School Program students were using Inspiration and Kurzweil to plan and organize a research project. Visiting teachers also observed how the interactive whiteboard could be used to support special education students.

The Assistive Technology Team was pleased with the success of our first demonstration classrooms and plans to offer more opportunities in the next school year.

Movement of Students and SEA Computers:

SEA computers can move with students when they transfer schools within TDSB. The receiving school can decide whether or not to accept the equipment depending on its ability to provide "access" to assistive technology through other hardware in the school, without the computer in question. A school may also have sufficient furniture, such as desks, chairs, and printers, and therefore may not want to accept the equipment from the sending school.

The sending and receiving schools should communicate regarding the movement of equipment. Please use the <u>SEA Transfer form</u> (found on the SEA website) to document all movement of equipment. Additionally, please inform your SEA Consultant if there is unused equipment.

Please ensure that all equipment is locked in a secure environment over the summer months.
